The City of Phoenix reports that water use at schools throughout the city have reduced water usage by 18 percent between 1990 and 2012. But, if schools were to follow the lead of Orangewood Elementary School in the Washington Elementary School District, they could reduce usage even more. Arizona school district makes a dramatic advancement in water conservation

When the sprinklers come on in the Washington Elementary School District, you can bet the soil needs a drink. The district has planted wireless irrigation controllers that measure moisture in the soil ensuring the system only turns on when it's needed. The irrigation system is part of a 15-year GESPC6. In a 14-month period, from April 2014 - June 2015, the district saved \$200,000 on its water bills in comparison to the previous 14 months. High efficiency equipment has been installed throughout the district schools, replacing 371 faucets, 322 toilets and 99 urinals, significantly reducing the gallons per flush as well as gallons per minute. <u>Click here</u> to read more from Cronkite News (Oct. 7, 2015)
